As the Chairman of the Foundation, I have pleasure in introducing the Annual Report of the Trustees for the year to 5 April 2010.

REFERENCE AND ADMINISTRATIVE INFORMATION

The Garfield Weston Foundation is a general grant-giving charity endowed by the late W Garfield Weston and members of his family, which is registered with the Central Register of Charities, registration number 230260. The Foundation is recognised by the Inland Revenue as an approved charity for tax purposes, the reference number being X96978.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Structure

The operation of the Foundation is governed by a Trust Deed dated 10 October 1958.

At 5 April 2010, the Foundation owned 79.2 percent of Wittington Investments Limited, a company registered in England. Wittington Investments is the ultimate holding company of Associated British Foods plc, which is listed on the International Stock Exchange, and Fortnum and Mason plc and Heal's plc. Under the terms of the Trust Deed, the investment in the Wittington Investments Limited group of companies forms the permanent capital endowment of the Foundation and the Trustees may not dispose of those investments except by a unanimous vote of all the Trustees.

Governance and management

In accordance with the Trust Deed, after the death of Mr W Garfield Weston and his wife, their descendants became Trustees. The number of Trustees is limited to ten but must be at least five. If the number of Trustees drops below five, new Trustees fall to be appointed from amongst the lineal descendants of W Garfield Weston.

Being family members, incoming Trustees are aware of the aims and objectives of the Foundation and the manner in which the Trustees carry out their responsibilities. Nearly all of the Trustees are on the board of other charitable entities either in the UK, the United States or Canada. The Foundation is a member of the Foundations Forum and also receives the main charities' journals. This ensures that the Trustees are well placed to keep up to date with developments in charity practice and regulations. In addition, the Trustees receive direct information in relation to important areas from both their secretary, who attends monthly meetings and is a practising lawyer with expertise in the charities' field, and from their auditors UHY Hacker Young LLP.

The Trustees are directly responsible for the management of the Foundation and hold regular meetings in order to consider grant applications for £100,000 or more and to ratify grants which have been made since their previous meeting. While the initial processing of grant applications is dealt with by the administrator, every application is seen by at least one of the Trustees. The Trustees also hold an annual meeting in order to adopt the Annual Report and Accounts and to carry out a formal review of the fulfilment of the Charity's aims and objectives and the investment performance over the year.

Risk management

The Trustees are satisfied that appropriate protection, systems and checks remain in place in order to mitigate exposure to major risks. As mentioned in the Report for the year ended 5 April 2009 and following the successful implementation of the new database, the Trustees instructed their auditors to carry out a full review of their grant making systems. The conclusion from the assessment was that overall the designed procedures which had been put in place by the Foundation to control the receipt of applications and the approval and the payment of grants should be effective in ensuring that grants are only paid to legitimate applicants. The report identified certain areas which might be improved, although none of the recommendations made were material to the levels of risk or the effectiveness of the existing controls. However, where practical, procedures have been implemented in order to deal with these recommendations.

Towards the end of the financial year, the Trustees also reviewed the service received from their current bankers and put in place a process for interviewing alternative providers in order to achieve a more efficient and up dated service.

The Trustees regularly review the levels of risk with their independent investment managers ensuring they are commensurate with investment returns. The continued employment of Rensburg Sheppards and Unigestion as investment managers which employ contrasting approaches to investing within the same risk and return criteria has continued to provide balanced investment returns in what continues to be a difficult market – see the section of this report headed 'Investment Performance' for further details. The Trustees also regularly review the performance of the underlying assets in the Wittington Investments Limited Group.

In the summer of 2009, the Charity Commission opened a regulatory compliance investigation into the Foundation. This was on the basis that certain donations to political parties and quasi political bodies between the years of 1993 and 2007 had been made by Wittington Investments Limited or certain of its subsidiaries. It was accepted that such donations could not have been made by the Foundation itself, but the issue was how the Trustees should have acted in relation to the donations given that they own a controlling stake in Wittington. Full details of the Charity Commission's views and the views of the Foundation in response can be seen in the Regulatory Compliance Report published on 31 March 2010. The Trustees have taken full legal advice from Charity Counsel on this matter and in particular in relation to any conflicts

of interest which might arise as a result of certain of the Trustees also being directors of Wittington Investments Limited and its subsidiaries. They have also taken this opportunity to review their procedures in relation to the exercise of their rights and responsibilities as shareholders of Wittington Investments Limited. The increase in legal fees since 2009, shown on page 21 of the Financial Statements, reflects the Foundation's share of the costs of dealing with the investigation.

INCOME AND GRANT-MAKING AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

The Trust Deed contains broad charitable objects which allow the Trustees, in their discretion, to pay or apply the income and, subject to the restrictions set out below, the capital of the Trust Fund to or for the benefit of any charitable bodies, trusts, associations, institutions or organisations.

This year, the Trustees have supported 1,529 (2009: 1,518) appeals out of a total of 3,183 applications (2009: 3,513). The total number of applications is fewer than last year although the total number of grants made has remained fairly static. There are a number of possible explanations for the reduction in the number of applications, which may be linked to the general financial recession. However, the Foundation has been able to maintain its general levels of giving throughout the financial crisis, owing mainly to the strength of its underlying investments both in terms of performance and dividend yield, and charities should not therefore be deterred by the current financial difficulties from making applications. The Trustees are conscious that financial conditions are challenging and therefore wish to be as flexible as possible in the manner in which they assist.

The Foundation's cash reserves are fully replenished following the payment of the last tranche of the substantial grant to Oxford University referred to in previous Annual Reports, and the Trustees are confident that they have sufficient financial resources to maintain their levels of grant giving and to deal with urgent requests for funding as and when they arise.

The total cash donations during the year amounted to just over £40 million (including the final tranche of the grant to Oxford University for the Bodleian Library) and, in addition, £2 million of forward commitments have been made during the course of the year. By comparison, the annual income receipts are shown in the accounts as just over £60 million. This is because Wittington Investments Limited accelerated dividends

which would normally have been paid in October 2010 and instead paid them in February 2010. The Trustees intend, however, to treat the balance of this income as income available for spending in the year 2010/2011 in order that patterns of giving are not unduly distorted. The Trustees would therefore be looking to make grants of around £40 million as usual during the next financial year.

The grants made, as usual, support a wide range of charitable activities, but the largest overall grants in terms of value were made in the Art (total £5,680,500) and Education (total £11,985,166) categories. These included a lead grant of £3 million to the British Museum for the new Research Institute for Science and Conversation and a grant of £1 million to the Royal Opera House towards core costs. A grant of £1 million was also made to the Royal Marsden Cancer Campaign and a further pledge for that sum was made to English Heritage towards the redevelopment of Stonehenge. Cancer Research UK received a £500,000 grant for its Clinical Trials Unit in Manchester and there were eight other grants for this amount. The remaining grants were mostly for £250,000 or less, thus enabling the Trustees to provide core support for as wide a range of projects as possible.

Grant-making policy

The Foundation continues to accept only appeals from UK registered charities. No applications from individuals are considered and the Trustees do not typically fund projects outside the UK, nor do they fund animal welfare charities. The Trustees aim to deal with each application within four months of its being received. All applications are considered on an individual basis but the Trustees will not consider any funding request made within 12 months of the outcome of a previous application. Whenever it is considered necessary or desirable, visits are made by Trustees and/or the Foundation's administrator in order to gain a better understanding of applicants' requirements. Regular contact is maintained with recipients of grants for monitoring purposes, including follow-up visits. The grant-making guidelines have recently been updated and a copy of these, which includes the criteria which are taken into consideration when assessing applications and the information which should be submitted with an application, is available on the Foundation's website (www.garfieldweston.org) or from the Foundation's office on request.

Public benefit

The Trustees have complied with section 4 of the 2006 Charities Act, having due regard for the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit when reviewing the Foundation's aims and objectives, when setting the grant making policy and in making awards.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

As mentioned above, despite the economic downturn, the Trustees have been able to maintain their previous levels of donations. This is in no small part due to the relatively good performance of their investment in the Wittington group of companies as compared with other sectors and the maintenance of dividend levels on that investment.

Investment performance

The period to 5 April 2010 showed some recovery in both of the non-Wittington portfolios, with the Rensburg Sheppards portfolio rising from just over £30m at the end of the previous financial year to over £39.7m and Unigestion rising from just over £35m to £38.8m. This reflects the strategic make-up of the two portfolios with Unigestion being structured so as to minimise downside risk but with possible lower capital growth. By comparison over the same period the RPI index increased by 8.4% and in the WM index for charities constrained by income by around 34%.

Following the recovery of the Rensburg Sheppards portfolio, quarterly income distributions have increased to £300,000 (from £240,000) with effect from 6 April 2010.

The Rensburg Sheppards/Savills' Charities Properties Fund has also increased in value over the year standing at a market value of £4.5 million (£4.2m as at 5 April 2009), although the estimated annual income has remained fairly constant (just over £370,000).

As mentioned above, the Foundation's principal investment in the Wittington Group has maintained a steady performance during a difficult investment climate and Wittington has been able to maintain its dividend levels. The Trustees receive a report on an annual basis which includes a detailed consideration of the underlying activities of Associated British Foods, Fortnum & Mason and Heal Holdings. Changes in the valuation of Associated British Foods are due to share price fluctuations as a result of market conditions and do not affect the dividend or the underlying profitability of the investment. Further analysis of the investment assets can be found in Note 8 to the Financial

Statements. A copy of Wittington Investments Limited's accounts for the year to 12 September 2009 can be obtained from the Foundation's principal office.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

In addition to grants paid, the Trustees also had, as at 5 April 2010, £3 million of forward commitments. Of these, however, £1 million had already been accounted for in earlier years. This is in accordance with the policy that grants are recognised in the statement of financial activities when approved by the Trustees and communicated to the recipients, irrespective of the future period over which payments are to be made, and the obligations outstanding at the year end are recognised as creditors.

The Report for the year ended 5 April 2009 recorded the entitlement of the Foundation to a 59.6% share in a Bermudian company called Clarendon Limited following the partition of a non-charitable trust. The entitlement was estimated at £4 million and recorded as a debtor as at 5 April 2009. The final settlement of £3.9 million was received on 25 March 2010 and as such the balance of £0.1 million has been written off to the Statement of Financial Activities.

Reserves

The Trustees are satisfied that the current level of income reserves is appropriate given the general timing of income receipts, their general pattern of giving and the current economic climate. The appropriate reserve levels going forwards will be reviewed over the forthcoming year.

Investment objectives

The Trustees' investment objectives as set out in the policy statement are to preserve the absolute value of the capital, whilst maintaining its 'real' value. The managers are instructed to adopt a relatively conservative investment strategy investing in a balanced portfolio without geographical, currency or sector restriction, subject to the terms of a Charity Commission Order dated 19 September 2001. The Trustees recognise that the revised investment performance benchmark of RPI plus 4% over a rolling three year period which they fixed in 2008 cannot be attained in the current market conditions and have instructed the two managers to minimise downward risk as far as possible while still maintaining the overall long term aim of capital growth and sustaining income levels.

The Trustees do not have any ethical investment policy. However, Associated British Foods and other

companies within the Wittington Investments Limited Group have ethical business practices.

Trustees' responsibilities for the financial statements

Charity law requires the Trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the charity's incoming resources and application of resources during the year and of its state of affairs at the end of the year. In preparing those financial statements the Trustees are required to

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable accounting standards and statements of recommended practice have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements; and
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in operation.

The Trustees are responsible for keeping proper records which disclose with reasonable accuracy the financial position of the charity and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities Act 1993. They are also responsible for safeguarding the charity's assets and hence taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and breaches of law and regulations.

PLANS FOR FUTURE PERIODS

During the last financial year the Trustees had anticipated an increase in funding needs, particularly among smaller charities, owing to the recession. While this appears not to have happened yet, the Trustees are conscious that cuts in Government funding may threaten the very existence of a number of smaller charities going forwards.

The Trustees themselves intend to continue to aim to preserve as far as possible the capital base of their investments and annual income levels. They will also be looking carefully at applications to ensure that projects for which capital funding is being sought are not unduly prejudicing the applicant charity's revenue going forwards. While the Trustees traditionally have

supported capital projects and do not generally provide revenue funding on an on-going basis, they would be willing to provide short term funding of this nature in order to support applicants during this difficult period.

In order to be able to continue to support a wide range of charitable activity consistent with their objects and their grant making policy and to help applicants in emergency situations, the Trustees will continue to be cautious about the overall level of grant awarded to each applicant.

GRANT ACTIVITY

Arts - £5,680,500 distributed in 96 grants

In the Arts category, the largest grant was made to the Royal Opera House (ROH) for £1million. The ROH has continued to develop since its major refurbishment and has been especially focused on widening participation and on education work to engage a broad range of audiences. The organisation has an ongoing challenge to balance the high fixed cost base required to maintain a quality repertoire with variable revenue, and is developing wider income streams from commercial activity. The grant was made to support work across the range of ROH's activities in acknowledgement of the excellence of its work and of the importance of having a sustainable financial base.

There were three grants made of £500,000; the first was to Sadler's Wells for the development of a new studio theatre through the acquisition of an adjacent building. The second £500,000 grant was to the Royal Shakespeare Company in Stratford-upon-Avon for the final phase of its new theatre and visitor facilities which are nearing completion and in the final stages of fundraising. The third grant was a pledge to the Rambert Dance Company for their new building.

Four grants of £250,000 were made: to The Royal Welsh College of Music & Drama; Chetham's School of Music

in Manchester, Bristol Old Vic Trust and the London Academy of Music & Dramatic Art. The Royal Welsh College of Music & Drama provides specialist practical and performance-based training for 600 students a year. The grant was towards a new building to house a new recital hall, theatre, four acting and movement studios, an exhibition space and a renovated television studio.

A grant of £200,000 was made to The Art Fund towards the purchase of The Staffordshire Hoard for the nation. With the discovery of 1,662 artefacts, the Hoard is the largest collection of Anglo-Saxon objects

ever found in England and includes over 5kg of gold and 1.5kg of silver. It is comprised solely of war-related items including gold crosses, helmet fixtures and sword pommels. The Hoard will be managed jointly by the Potteries Museum in Stoke-on-Trent and the Birmingham Museum and Art Gallery, ensuring the artefacts are conserved appropriately and are available for public viewing.

The Midlands Arts Centre, “mac”, received £100,000 for a major refurbishment and renovation project. The centre is an arts venue in Birmingham offering a wide range of activities for all ages, including theatre, music, dance, pottery, films and exhibitions. The revived spaces provide improved access, a new performing arts studio, double height gallery, café and bar area, larger non-gallery exhibition spaces, refurbished pottery studios, a digital media studio and improved visitor facilities.

Community - £1,803,600 distributed in 284 grants

In general this category is notable for a high volume of grants. The Trustees remain aware that relatively small grants can have a transformational effect in this category as they are proportional to the size of projects. Another feature of this category is the fact that grants

are spread widely across all parts of the UK as activity is not necessarily concentrated in the major cities and urban areas – grants include the smallest hamlets and villages in remote areas.

The largest grant in this category was for £100,000 to the Bishopsgate Institute near Liverpool Street Station in London. Each year the Institute has nearly 80,000 visitors who use the facilities and library and attend courses and events. The library holds over 110,000 items and includes unique book and archive collections which provide a focus for research into the history of London, in particular the East End, and the freethought, early labour, humanist, and co-operative movements. A major renovation project is transforming the Institute into a fully refurbished and vibrant centre. The refurbishment will include updating the Great Hall into a state-of-the-art performing arts venue, creating a dedicated learning space, a café, a specialist Library archive store, disabled access and modern studios. The project will also clean, repair and illuminate the striking façade of the building.

Other examples of grants in this category include the North London Muslim Community Centre and Credit Action.

Education - £11,985,166 distributed in 126 grants

This category received the highest proportion of funds granted this financial year and it is notable that this sector includes a broad range of activities, from museums and science centres to special schools and education in specialist subjects such as ballet. The largest grant made was to the British Museum which received £3 million towards the new Research Institute for Science and Conservation – while based in central London it is anticipated that work conducted in this Centre will benefit galleries and museums across the country for the research and preservation of precious historical artefacts. The existing facilities are not fit for purpose with difficult-to-access spaces and lack of light, the new Centre will provide state-of-the-art research and conservation laboratories as well as a special exhibition gallery to engage the public in conservation activity.

There were five grants made of £500,000; one such was made to the Centre for Life in Newcastle which provides hands-on science education that cannot be replicated in the classroom, along with workshops for all ages, a planetarium and a series of permanent exhibition galleries with spaces aimed at different audiences and age groups. The grant was towards the refurbishment of a permanent exhibition space called “Curiosity” which is designed to encourage experimentation and interactive learning. Exeter University also received £500,000 as part of a major campus refurbishment, as did the Royal Society for the development of Chicheley Hall, a residential centre for science and learning near Milton Keynes. The Historic Royal Palaces received £500,000 towards the upgrade of public spaces at Kensington Palace, enabling a more interactive accessible and vibrant experience for visitors. The fifth grant of £500,000 was to the Science

Museum in London for a major new gallery on Climate Change.

The grant of £350,000 for Wells Cathedral School was towards their capital campaign to build a new music hall with performance and teaching spaces along with quality recording facilities.

There were ten grants of £250,000 which included the Scott Polar Research Institute at Cambridge University, and Edinburgh Napier University. All grants made of £250,000 were for capital purposes. The Scott Polar Research Institute, which is the UK's only dedicated polar museum and is a national repository for archives recording some of the most memorable episodes in the exploration of the Arctic and Antarctic, is creating a suite of new galleries which will exhibit many unseen items as well as enabling wider educational outreach.

Donations of £100,000 included Cheltenham Museum, Reading University, the Royal National College for the Blind in Hereford and the Museum of East Anglia.

Religion - £2,828,050 distributed in 426 grants

As with previous years, this category received the highest volume of grants and, as with the Community Category, a feature of this sector is the wide geographical spread of grants across the UK, reflecting the position of many churches in remote and rural areas. Many grants in this category are made to support fabric repair projects to listed church buildings across the country which are

an important part of the UK's heritage and which also perform a vital function as community meeting spaces, especially for those requiring support such as the elderly and those with young families. The Foundation has supported such projects since its inception over 50 years ago and the Trustees are delighted to continue this work.

There were two grants of £250,000 in this category; one to the Cathedral and Abbey Church of St Alban for fabric repair and restoration works and the other to St Mellitus College. The Cathedral and Abbey Church of St Alban is documented from early times and the building has the longest nave in the UK, along with magnificent views from the top of the tower. The building has a wealth of ancient features and an active congregation - the work of the cathedral is supported by over 1000 volunteers. The grant was to support the most urgent repairs including replacement wiring, stonework repairs in the nave, new guttering and refurbishment to the West of the Cathedral.

St Mellitus is a theological training college of the Church of England based in the dioceses of London and Chelmsford. A key part of their approach is to offer practical hands-on training in communities combined with academic theological study to provide a thorough and realistic preparation for full-time ministry. The grant was made towards the fit-out costs of new library and teaching facilities, spaces for filming lectures and seminars, and web-enabled technology to allow courses to be transmitted to colleges across the world.

Other significant grants in this category include grants of £100,000 to the Norwich Cathedral Trust and to St Patrick's in Soho Square in London, both for refurbishments to community and congregation facilities.

Welfare - £2,875,500 distributed in 224 grants

The largest grant in this category was to Methodist Homes for the Aged for £250,000 towards a new residential dementia care and nursing centre in Harwich which will complement existing services for the elderly on the site. The project will provide care and accommodation for over 70 people with 24-hour expert assistance available while enabling maximum possible independence for the residents.

There were five grants of £100,000 in this category which included Human Rights Watch, The Mayor's Fund, Lench's Trust, ExtraCare and Erskine. The grant to Human Rights Watch was for general operational costs and both grants to ExtraCare and Lench's Trust were for supported accommodation for the elderly.

Other recipients in this category included the Sir Oswald Stoll Foundation for homes for ex-Service personnel; the Forgiveness Project for their work with offenders and victims in running restorative justice programmes and to St Cuthbert's Centre in West London for practical support to the homeless with the provision of healthy hot meals, washing facilities and advice.

Youth - £2,351,050 distributed in 200 grants

As in previous years, the activities in one category may overlap with others and this is especially true for the youth category where much good work with young people is also undertaken by community and church groups across the country. The items noted in the Youth sector have been specifically dedicated to the benefit of young people and range from organisations such as Scouting and Boys' Brigade to mentoring and support for training and employment.

The largest grant made in this category was to Fairbridge and was for £250,000. Fairbridge runs personal development courses for young people, especially the "NEET" population, addressing the issues of long term unemployment, crime, drugs, abuse & antisocial behaviour. Over 3,000 young people participate in their programmes annually across 13 centres operating in the most disadvantaged areas of the UK.

Three grants of £100,000 were made to the The British Sports Trust, the Outward Bound Trust (OBT) and The Challenge Network. The grant to the OBT was towards

the costs involved in engaging disadvantaged children with outdoor adventure and learning programmes – over half the participants receive some level of financial assistance each year and around 26,000 young people benefit from OB T programmes annually.

The Sports Leaders grant was towards core costs; the organisation runs courses across the UK enabling young people to achieve awards and qualifications in tandem with leading community groups in sporting activity. These awards enable young people to learn essential skills of leadership, including communication, organisation and motivation, as well as developing into good volunteers. Sport Leaders has identified 25 key locations across the country in the most deprived areas and is placing particular emphasis on working in these areas.

Environment - £2,253,000 distributed in 30 grants

The largest grant in this category was a pledge made to English Heritage for £1million towards the Stonehenge project to create a visitor centre with appropriate facilities, including re-routing the busy road that drives traffic right through the stones of this World Heritage site. The importance of this particular site to the UK's environmental heritage is incomparable and the project combines excellent facilities for the large number of visitors to the site while ensuring low impact on the important landscape and archaeological sites surrounding Stonehenge.

Other significant grants in this category include £250,000 to Oceana UK which aims to protect and restore the oceans of the world which are suffering from pollution, over-fishing and damaging practices such as bottom-trawling. The grant was for a range of projects aimed at delivering benefits to marine biodiversity in the UK, including the preservation of coral reefs along the Scottish coast and of algae and marine seagrass species at risk from over-fishing and damaging practices.

A grant of £100,000 was made to the Durrell Institute for Conservation Education (DICE) which undertakes research, training and the management of international biodiversity projects. This grant was towards bursaries for DICE's highly successful Masters degree in Conservation Biology which aims to educate students in the key issues (especially political, legal and social) required to generate change in behaviour and practice.

Health - £4,158,946 distributed in 108 grants

In the health category the largest grant was for £1million to the Royal Marsden Hospital towards a fully updated Critical Care Unit (CCU). The hospital experienced a fire in January 2008 and is using the resulting repairs as an opportunity to upgrade facilities as insurance covers only like-for-like replacement. The new CCU will include spaces for younger patients, a seminar room for staff development and private areas for discussion with patients and their families. The unit has also been designed to maximise the availability of natural light, a key factor in recovery and wellbeing. With the creation of updated spaces will also come the implementation of a highly sophisticated information system which will allow staff to monitor patient progress on a real-time basis, as well as to provide data on patient trends, a system which will contribute to research as well as to patient care on a more immediate basis.

The second most significant grant in this category was for £500,000 to Cancer Research UK for the new clinical trials unit at The Christie Hospital in Manchester, the largest cancer hospital in Western Europe with around 34,000 new cases annually. The current unit within the hospital is housed on a temporary basis in prefabricated accommodation but lacks space and flexibility, despite receiving around 10,000 patient visits annually. The new unit will provide state-of-the-art laboratories, consultation and treatment rooms and a chemotherapy suite. These new facilities will double the number of patients; once completed the unit will be able to accommodate 2,400 patients participating in 750 trials.

A grant of £250,000 was made to the Royal United Hospital in Bath (Friends Forever Appeal) towards the new neonatal Intensive Care Unit which cares for nearly 500 fragile babies annually. The existing unit is old and cramped and the new centre will provide more space for cots and incubators, privacy for parents and teaching space for professional staff.

Eight grants of £100,000 were made which included grants to the University of Dundee, Birmingham Children's Hospital and the Motor Neurone Disease Association. The grant to the University of Dundee was for the new Institute of Academic Anaesthesia which will focus on developing more effective approaches to pain relief and safer anaesthetic drugs.

Other - £289,000 distributed in 15 grants

There are relatively few grants that do not fit easily within the Foundation's existing categories, but some examples include a donation of £30,000 to New Philanthropy Capital towards the core costs of providing advice to charities and for conducting research. A grant of £10,000 was made to Transparency International for their research and information work.

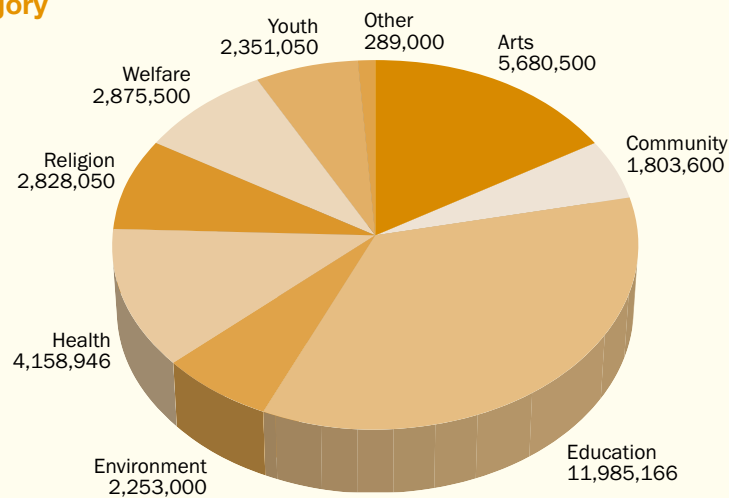

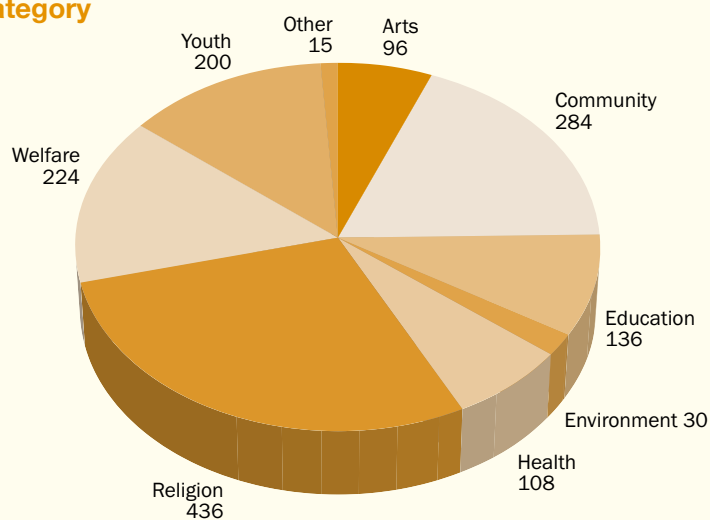

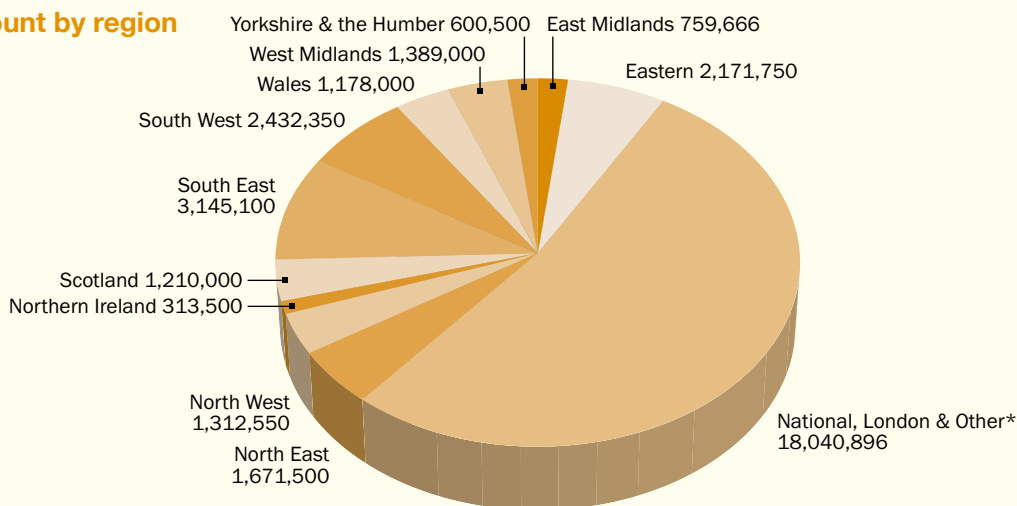
Total amount by category



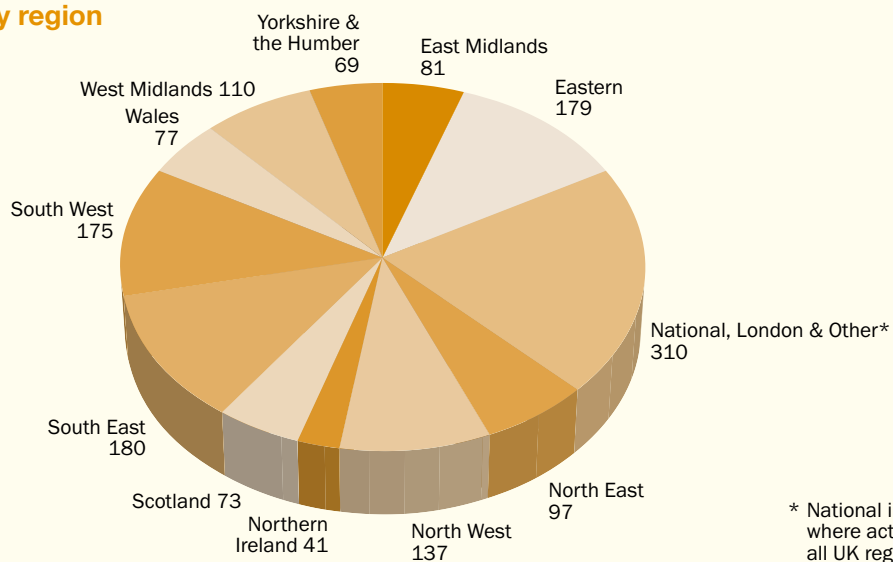
Number of appeals by category

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 5 APRIL 2010

1. Accounting Policies

The financial statements are prepared under the Charities Act 1993 in accordance with applicable accounting standards, and the related Statement of Recommended Practice on Accounting and Reporting by Charities (SORP 2005) issued in March 2005 in all material respects, except as stated in paragraph 1(i) below. The particular accounting policies adopted by the Trustees are described below:

a) Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention as modified by the revaluation of investments.

b) Investments

Investments are stated at valuation at the balance sheet date as follows:

- at the Trustees' valuation of the unquoted equity investments as explained in note 8.
- at the market value of the managed portfolios as advised by the fund managers.

c) Incoming resources

Dividends are included when received. Interest receivable on fixed interest securities and bank deposits is included on an accruals basis. All incoming resources are recognised once the Charity has entitlement to the resources, it is certain that the resources will be received and the monetary value of incoming resources can be measured with sufficient reliability.

d) Resources expended and irrecoverable VAT

Liabilities are recognised as resources expended as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the Charity to the expenditure. All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category.

Grants awarded are charged in the year when formally awarded by the Trustees and communicated to the recipient irrespective of the period covered by the donation as they are regarded by the Trustees as financial obligations.

Irrecoverable VAT is charged against the category of resources expended for which it was incurred.

e) Allocation of overhead and support costs

Overhead and support costs are allocated first between charitable activity and governance. Overhead and support costs relating to charitable activities have been apportioned based on the value of individual grant awards made as it is considered that more is spent awarding, monitoring and assessing grants of greater value. The allocation of overhead and support costs is analysed in note 5.

f) Costs of generating funds

The costs of generating funds consist of investment management fees and commissions.

g) Charitable activities

Costs of charitable activities include grants made and an apportionment of overhead and support costs as shown in notes 3 and 4.

h) Governance costs

Governance costs comprise all costs involving the public accountability of the Charity and its compliance with regulation and good practice. These costs include costs related to statutory audit and legal fees together with an apportionment of overhead and support costs.

i) Interest in Wittington Investments Limited

At 5 April 2010 the Foundation owned 79.2% (2009: 79.2%) of Wittington Investments Limited, a company registered in England. Wittington Investments Limited is the ultimate holding company of Associated British Foods plc, Fortnum & Mason plc and Heal Holdings Limited. Associated British Foods is listed on the International Stock Exchange whereas Fortnum & Mason and Heal Holdings are unlisted subsidiary undertakings. The Foundation receives its income from Wittington Investments Limited by way of dividends and records its investment in that company at Trustees' valuation.

As the activities of Wittington Investments Limited and its subsidiaries are fundamentally different from the activities of the Foundation, consolidated accounts have not been prepared as the Trustees are of the opinion that the adopted policy gives a true and fair view of the Foundation's assets and sources of income. Details of the consolidated accounts of Wittington Investments Limited are shown in note 8 to these accounts. The Trustees have agreed this policy with the Charity Commission.

j) Fixed assets investments

Investments are stated at market value as at the balance sheet date. The statement of financial

activities includes the net gains and losses arising on revaluation and disposals throughout the year.

k) Realised gains and losses

All gains and losses are taken to the statement of financial activities as they arise. Realised gains and losses on investments are calculated as the difference between sales proceeds and opening market value. Unrealised gains and losses are calculated as the difference between the market value at the year end and opening market value. Realised and unrealised gains are not separated in the Statement of Financial Activities.

l) Fund accounting

Details of the nature and purpose of each fund are set out in note 11.

Wittington also owns a 100% interest in the ordinary shares of Fortnum and Mason plc and 75% of Heal Holdings Limited and the values of these investments have been based on the Trustees' valuation on 5 April 2010. In arriving at this valuation no regard has been paid to the size of the Foundation's interest or to the percentage controlling interest. The Trustees have no current intention of disposing of the interest in Wittington.

In accordance with the authority given to the Trustees under an Order of the Charity Commission dated 19 September 2001, £65,747,000 was transferred to an expendable capital fund in relation to which income and capital are distributable at the discretion of the Trustees. £5 million was invested in 2001/02 in the Charities Property Fund and £60 million was invested in 2002/03 with investment managers in balanced portfolios on a discretionary total return basis. Income and investment gains and losses are taken to this fund and the amount allocated to income by the Trustees, £6,894,000 (2009: £5,000,000), is shown as a transfer to the income fund.

Unrestricted income funds

The income of the Foundation is expendable at the discretion of the Trustees in furtherance of the objects of the Foundation. Gains on investments held in the income funds are credited to these funds.
